Project Description	<p>The Course on Credentialed Cooperative Director (CCCD) is adapted from the United States National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) Certificate Program which promotes good governance and additional skills development for board directors. Specifically, the course integrates topics needed by directors in all aspects of operations, financial management, challenges in electricity business and strategies. Thus the course helps in improving the wise business decisions that would benefit the cooperative.</p> <p>The CCCD is being implemented by the Development Academy of the Philippines in partnership with the National Electrification Administration (NEA) and support from NRECA. The course started in October 2011 and</p>												



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	expected to complete in September 2015 to cover the total target of 80 electric cooperatives for the duration of the contract under NRECA.
